Eight Ways to Get Your SOURCEBOOK Teaching Questions Answered—Pronto!

Have questions? Get answers!

Here are eight ways for you to get your Sourcebook teaching questions answered.

1. Call me. My home number is in your Sourcebook—480-473-7277. During the day, chances are I'm not at home, but at the office. The toll-free office number is also in your Sourcebook—888-937-7355.
2. Email your questions to me at rsitton@sittonspelling.com and I'll provide answers.
3. Set up a conference call. With a speaker phone at your end, you and your colleagues can ask me questions. To set up a conference call, call the office toll free at 888-937-7355. Then, at the designated time, call the toll-free number again, and I'll be waiting for your call. It's complimentary—no charge for the call, no charge for my time. I want to help you.
4. Read the sidenote questions in your Sourcebook Teaching Notes. The answers are adjacent to the questions. I've anticipated what your questions might be, so this is an easy way to get quick answers.
5. Use your grade-level Tutor Me Training CD-ROM for my guided tour through your first Sourcebook unit. Each subsequent unit follows the same format. I highly recommend Tutor Me upon implementation. Then keep a set for each grade level in your staff development library for new teachers who come on board later.
